He has been the Leader for Youthful Spirits Music for 12 years and volunteers with the Rise & Shine Community Breakfast program. He procures musical instruments for new immigrants and repairs donated bikes to be distributed to children in need. He contributes his time to organizations such as Southlake Hospital, Aurora Royal Canadian Legion, Special Olympics, Hope House Hospice, and assists with countless fundraisers in the community. The Optimist Club of Aurora

The Optimist Club of Aurora has been involved in supporting Aurora youth programs and activities for the last 35 years. The Club has supported youth through its donations to projects such as the Town of Aurora beach volleyball courts, Flip Side, the Highview accessible playground, Children's Safety Village, Theatre Aurora and many more. Sam is a reliable, trustworthy and outstanding neighbour that everyone would be fortunate to have on their street.

Luka Miljanov

Luka has been 3D printing and building masks from polyactic acid to donate to local long-term care facilities in Aurora. During the COVID-19 pandemic, many of these facilities were not able to sustain the proper amount of Personal Protective Equipment that they needed. Luka chose to make the masks out of environmentally conscious material, which is renewable and would not have a large impact on the environment. Luka has donated 40 masks, with a goal to donate at least 100 in total. Luka recognized that essential health care workers deserve to feel secure and require these materials to do their job correctly and safely. He has displayed strong leadership in this area by his charitable and admirable act of using his own equipment and material to give back to support his community. Luka exemplifies kindness, innovation, selflessness and has inspired us all to help our community feel safe.

Joe Anselmo, Harvey's Swiss Chalet

For the past three years, the restaurant has provided 250 free meals for Welcoming Arms during the Christmas holidays and has donated food to many fundraisers and organizations. The restaurant often provides free lunch for students that don't have enough funds and offers affordable lunches to school programs. Harvey's Swiss Chalet in Aurora has sponsored numerous soccer and baseball teams and continues to be a valuable part of the Aurora community. When new families arrive in our community, she has assigns community supports and services that will visit them in their homes and help them with language barriers, as well as to navigate community services.
