Prayer of Great Thanksgiving

Led by a fiery pillar blazing in the wilderness night, Moses led a grumbling people into identity as a People of God. Following the glorious light of a persistent star, Wise Ones discovered your vulnerability in a baby boy.

Hiking to a mountain top for prayer and for retreat, three disciples witnessed your revealed glory in Jesus; the Word made flesh, a light of humble self-giving for all people. Fear, intrigue, uncertainty and doubt overtook too many. Though Jesus brought liberation to the oppressed as the Light of the World, we were stopped by our fears,

choosing the familiar instead of the just.

But you, O God, continued to bring forth light, raising the crucified one to life and to wholeness. Therefore, we join with all creation to sing:

O Holy, holy holy God, O God of time and space. All earth and sea and sky above bear witness to your grace. Hosanna in the highest heav'n, creation sings your praise. And blessed is the One who comes and bears your name always. (MV 203)
