SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION

Prayer of Great Thanksgiving

Let us open our hearts to the One who breaks bread. We offer our doubt, our fears, our needs. Let us give thanks to the Root of the vine. We offer our hope, our joy, our praise.

We praise you, Source and Sustainer of life: in love you cause all things to be; from stardust and spirit you weave our humanity; when we mourn, your tears comfort us; when we weary you, your prophets pursue us; when we come home, your feast awaits us. Thank you, gracious Host for inviting us to your table, though we are separated from one another. Here, we receive bread to sustain us on our journey, and share life's cup of laughter and tears.

We give thanks for the life and ministry of Jesus, who feeds us and feasts with us, who heals us and suffers with us, who proclaims the nearness of your reign. Christ's death and resurrection release us from the poverty of brokenness and teaches us how to die so that we may live.

Therefore, with all creation and all creatures, with all who hunger for your reign and hope for new creation we share the song of praise which echoes through the universe:

O holy, holy God, O God of time and space, all earth and sea and sky above bear witness to your grace. Hosanna in the highest heav'n, creation sings your praise. And blessed is the One who comes and bears your name always.(MV 203)

At his last meal with his friends, Jesus renewed your covenant promise. He took bread, sign of their work together; He blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them, symbol of his body they would become.
