The Presbyterian Vote

The Aurora Banner Nov. 7. 1924:

Members of all the Presbyterian churches in this district attended a meeting held on Tuesday at St. Andrew's Church Newmarket to advance the Anti-Union cause.

Rev. Walter Amos of Toronto acted as chairman and Rev. H.H. Horne, Rev. J.H. Borland and G. Tower Ferguson, all of Toronto addressed the large gathering explaining the act governing the union and telling those present how they may vote themselves out of Church Union. At the conclusion of the meeting the ladies of the church served tea.

St. Andrew's Church votes -

On Monday evening Dec. 15th at 8 pm a congregational meeting will be held in the church for conference among the members and adherents on the Church Union situation.

The voting on the question of Church Union for St. Andrew's Church here is being held at intervals and will continue till Jan. 31st when the ballot will be closed.

St. Andrew's Church (Aurora) Defeats Union

On Monday evening the results of two weeks voting on church union was announced at one of the shortest meetings yet held in connection with the church balloting. At 8 o'clock Rev. J.R. Conn, pastor of the church called the congregation to order and the poll clerk J.B. Grieg announced that 70 votes had been cast in favor of union and 74 against. At 8:10 pm the meeting was adjourned.



July 18th, 1930 - October 23rd, 2024


We extend our heartfelt condolences and prayers to the family of Joan Dies. Joan and her husband Bill were faithful members of Aurora United Church for many years.
